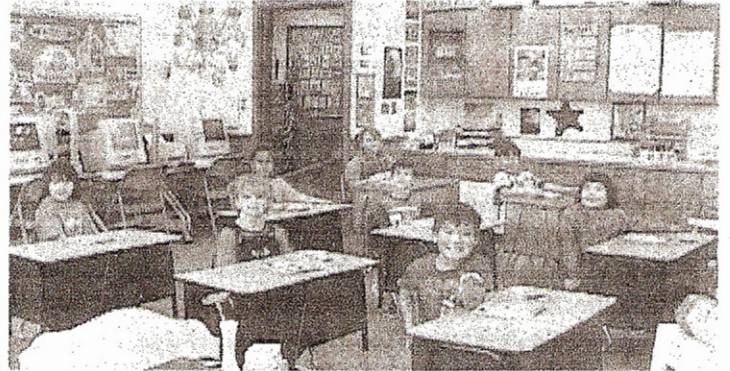

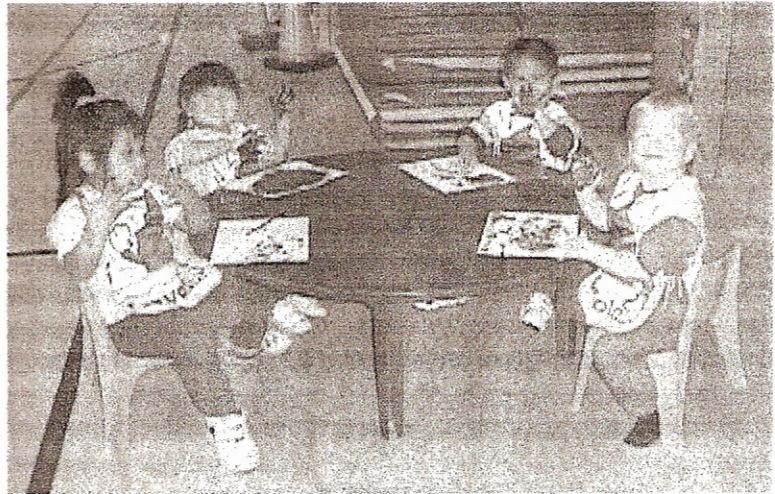
Snow falling gently from the sky reminds me of,

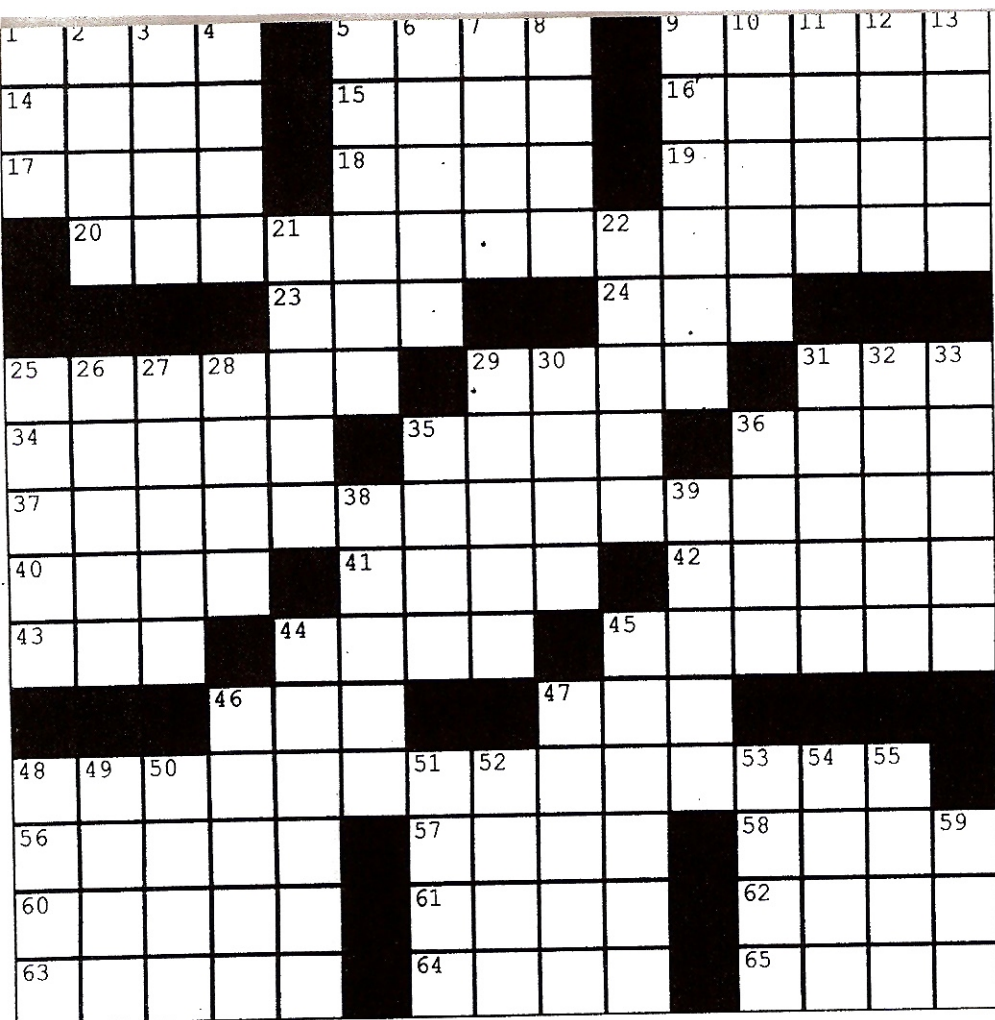
